March Faculty Recital

Juanita Tsu, pianist; Valerie Geller, violinist; and Doug Custance, Baritone will be featured in a unique Concert on stage in the Main Lounge of Clubhouse 7 at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 12th. Mr. Custance and Ms. Tsu serve as director and accompanist for the Village Chorale while Ms. Geller is director of the Symphony Orchestra of Laguna Woods. Mr. Custance and Ms. Geller are on the faculty of Saddleback College Emeritus Institute. Ms. Tsu served on the faculty of University of Massachusetts, Lowell for 23 years.

APRIL CHORAL CONCERT

A Saturday, March 21st concert at the Orange County Performing Arts Center in Costa Mesa will include the "Chichester Psalms," written by Leonard Bernstein for boy treble or countertenor solo, choir and orchestra. Bernstein stated explicitly in his writing that the solo part may be sung by a countertenor or a boy soprano, but never by a woman. This was to reinforce the idea that this "Psalm of David" from the Hebrew Bible, was to be heard as if sung by the boy David himself.

Upper balcony tickets for the 7:30 p.m. concert can be purchased through Doug Custance Tuesdays through March 10th at \$20 per seat. Carpooling for the concert will be arranged.

Other musical offerings by the Choral Society will be "I Can Tell the World," "Elijah Rock," "He's Got the Whole World In His Hands," "Were You There," Leonard Bernstein's "Overture to Candide," and Sergei Rachmaninoff's "Concerto # 2." for piano and orchestra.

COUNT THEM : SEVENTEEN

Seventeen members have been added to the roster of the Village Chorale this semester pushing membership to a current peak of 98 members.

New to the Chorale this semester are tenors Nessa Goldstein and Jimmy Tung and basses Graham Johnson and Albert Yu. New altos are Marcy Barr, Karin Johnson, Maxine Quitiquit, and Margaret Silbar, Sopranos Hanne Booth, Betty Chang, Elizabeth Chen, Geraldine Farragler, Sung Ja Kim, Ann Linthorst, Noreen Maiorano, Yvonne Wang, and Marie Yang are also new to the Chorale. Two who joined the group this year have dropped but hope to come back next fall.

Holding the record for most number of years in the Chorale is Soprano Maribeth Clausen who joined in 1988.

Four current members joined the Chorale in 2000 - Dick Bissell, Shelly Ellman, Kay Jones, and Betty Denton. Four members joined in '01, four members joined in '02, five joined in '03, and only two were new in '04. Thirteen began in '05, eight in '06, and ten in '07. In January a year ago eight joined and last fall twelve of our current members joined. Two long-term members, Phyllis Trilling and Shirley Mitchell, have dropped since the first rehearsal on January 13th.

Total membership as we go to print is 98. Twenty one of us live outside the Village - in Laguna Hills, Mission Viejo, Lake Forest, Aliso Viejo, Laguna Niguel, Trabuco Canyon, Dana Point, Irvine, Corona del Mar, Monarch Beach, and Newport Coast.

There are 44 sopranos, 27 altos, 9 tenors, and 18 basses. However, attendance records for the first five weeks of the semester indicate huge absences - especially among the sopranos. Averages were: sopranos - 32; altos - 23; tenors - 7; and basses - 16.
